What was one of the most impactful things you learned from COJ on your grief journey?

It's hard to name one thing because many at COJ know firsthand how messy grief actually is. COJ taught me healthy boundaries for dealing with my grief, to claim my grief, to accept where I am in my journey, and to know it is okay to regress during the journey. They taught me how to own and control difficult conversations and interactions, and prepped me with conditioned responses to easily navigate the tough moments. They allow you to feel that you're the only person experiencing grief but also that you're not alone in your grief/journey. At some point, we all feel our grief is the worst possible grief, that no one could top our grief, and COJ walks you through the journey to the realization that we are stronger when sharing our grief with others who understand.

What would you say about COJ to someone else who has lost a loved one?

Absolutely give COJ a chance to repair your heart and soul to return to some semblance of a functioning human. Give those who have experienced and endured grief the opportunity to help you. And if nothing else, it gives you an opportunity to share your story with others, and by doing so they help to keep your loved one's spirit alive! That is all any of us want when losing someone special.


